Parish Directory Addendum

Last year we purchased new church management software. This is the software that maintains the church membership, contributions, and all the necessary bits and pieces of data that pass through our church lives. The new 2018 Parish Directory that your Deacon is in the process of delivering, is the first directory printed with the new software. And ... with anything new, there are hiccups. Where the old software offered just one option, the new software offers several and each of

those options offers additional options. Whew!

So, first, we apologize for the names that were omitted from the directory. Second, we've printed an addendum (center insert) and ask that you tuck it into your new directory for future reference. Third, please let us know of any additions, corrections, changes that need to be made to the Parish Directory to keep it accurate. Your help and understanding are most appreciated.

Electronic Distribution

A note about electronic distribution. The QR Codes are a gimmick, a gadget, a convenience. It stands for Quick Response Code. You scan the code with a QR Code reader—an app on your cell phone or tablet—and you're transported to the link on the website with no fuss—no muss.

But QR Codes aren't the only way to access information. Our bulletins and newsletters are always available on the church's website at: <https://presbyterianwarren.com/publications/bulletins/>. The monthly newsletter is always available here: <https://presbyterianwarren.com/publications/newsletters/> Bookmark these links and you'll always have quick access to this information.

As Rebecca states in her article, the Weekly Update is a weekly email

that is also printed and posted on the church bulletin board. However, the program used to email the Weekly Update won't allow us to include attachments.

The monthly newsletter will be sent as a PDF attachment to an email though our church management software, Power Church. There are still some concerns in regards to reaching everyone, so please make the church office aware of any issues. Other forms of distribution include mailing or picking up your copy at Sunday worship.

However you receive your monthly newsletter, our goal is to provide everyone with an option that best suites their needs.



Wheels for Josh

In September, 2017 a conversation was initiated at the Ramseyer Training Centre in Abetifi-Kwahu at the Ghana Mission Network meeting. Josh Heikkila serves as the Presbyterian Church (USA) regional liaison for West Africa. In that position Josh relates to Presbyterian Churches in Ghana, Nigeria, Niger, and Togo. The work he does involves extensive travel under daunting conditions. It is no surprise that motor vehicles bear the brunt of travel on these roads. It is also no surprise that vehicles wear out – which is exactly what has happened for Josh in the ministry in which we share with him.

A conversation in September at Abetifi-Kwahu led to action on two continents over a period of several months. The Presbytery of Lake Erie voted to provide an initial gift in November, as well as providing dollar-for-dollar matching gifts. The matching gifts were made available to churches within the Presbytery of Lake Erie as well as churches and presbyteries in the Ghana Mission Network.



The kind of vehicle Josh Heikkila intends to purchase in the near future, thanks to the financial support of churches and presbyteries across both Ghana and the United States.

Out of God's generosity an abundance of gifts have been received in order to support 'Wheels for Josh.' Over the past six months 16 of the 58 churches in Lake Erie Presbytery provided extra commitment gifts of more than \$9,900. Nine partner churches and presbyteries across the Ghana Mission Network in the United States also contributed matching money totaling \$6,400. Including the matching money from Lake Erie Presbytery a grand total of \$31,301.78 was raised, by the grace of God, for 'Wheels for Josh' across the Ghana Mission Network! First Presbyterian Church of Warren, PA contributed \$1,933.33.






